

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

Press conference - Bundesarchiv and Wikimedia Germany

Starting on Thursday December 4, 2008, Wikimedia Commons witnessed a massive upload of new images. We received more than 80,000 files from a donation from the German Federal Archives 2. These images are mostly related to the history of Germany (including the German Democratic Republic) and are part of a cooperation between Wikimedia Germany 2 and the Federal Archives.

These images are licensed *Creative Commons Attribution ShareAlike 3.0 Germany License (CC-BY-SA).* Wikimedia Germany and the

Federal Archives have signed a cooperation agreement that, among other things, asserts that the Federal Archives owns sufficient rights to be able to grant this kind of license.

§ 1

§ 3

§ 4

Sachliche Gebührenfreiheit, Gebührenbefreiung

(1) Gebühren werden nicht erhoben

- 1. für mündliche und einfache schriftliche Auskünfte,
- in den § 7 Nr. 2 bis 4 des Verwaltungskostengesetzes entsprechenden Fällen.

(2) Gebührenbefreiung besteht ferner für Benutzungen zu wissenschaftlichen Zwecken nach dem Gebührenverzeichnis

- 1. den Nummern 1.1 und 1.2,
- der Nummer 3, wenn nicht mehr als eine Stunde Arbeitszeit aufgewendet werden muss.

(3) Auf die Gebühr nach Nr. 4.11 kann das Bundesarchiv bei einer Auflage bis zu 500 Exemplaren verzichten.
